Glossary

Unipolar power: When one state holds significant power without fierce competitors amid international anarchy

Triple power transition: A concurrent shift in power dynamics throughout three areas: environmental, digital, and social

America First strategy: Populist political theory that advocates for focusing solely on domestic policy rather than global affairs

Westphalian principles: A principle in international law that each state has complete and exclusive sovereignty over its territory

1815 Congress of Vienna model: A meeting of European powers meant to forge a peaceful balance of power that set the precedent for later organizations like the League of Nations (1919) and United Nations (1945)

Global East: Region of the world with varying definitions, geographically including Far Eastern parts of Asia, Eastern Europe, the former Soviet Union, and the Middle East

Global North: Region of the world with varying definitions, typically the nations characterized by high levels of economic and industrial development

Global South: Region of the world with varying definitions, typically the nations regarded as having low levels of economic and industrial development

Global West: Region of the world with varying definitions, geographically referring to various nations in the regions of Western Europe, Northern America, and Australia
